### VIII. OLD BUSINESS

1. <u>Proposal from T&L and updated schedule-Adair, LRCVR, and Pinhook Rd Waterline Extension.</u>

See attached proposal. The Board collectively agreed to not pay anything up and pay the bills as they arise. Chairman Belcher spoke with Commissioner Young and asked for an additional \$50K. Commissioner Young is to bring it up at the next council meeting and let the District know.

No progress at this time.

### 3. Water Loss Update

Mr. Robertson reported the District is still hovering at 25% loss.

### 4. <u>Update Agreement Chimney Ridge MHP</u>

Mr. Harvey found easements granting the District for the raw waterlines and ingress/egress. Attached is an agreement between Mr. Young and Red Sulphur PSD that was signed by Mr. Young.

### 5. Safety Meeting Update

Porter reported there had been two safety meetings held since the last Board Meeting. Kevin asked Porter if everyone was traffic control and flagger certified. Porter said everyone had been certified except Chris.

### 6. Hayworth Sewer Project

Porter delivered to Mr. Hayworth's the invoice for \$5,091.50. Mr. Hayworth stated that he would not pay that amount. He would pay \$3,000 and grant an easement through his property for RSPSD future use. Mr. Hayworth called the West Virginia Public Service Commission and later stated that he did not want to pay anything for the relocation of the sewer line. An engineer from the PSC is going to meet with Porter later to discuss the requested relocation of the line and Mr. Hayworth's complaint. Mr. Hayworth also damaged the line to the Brown property when he built his horse barn. That line will need to be repaired to the satisfaction of the District. Mr. Hayworth will be responsible for the entire expense.

A motion was made that Mr. Hayworth be responsible for the entire cost (\$5,091.50) of the sewer line relocation on his property.

Porter reported that there not has not been any rain and flows were low.

### 8. Sonny Horney Lot

Porter reported the water line has been relocated. Mr. Horney asked that the sewer line be relocated as well so he would be able to dig a basement for the new home. Mr. Horney will pay the entire cost of the sewer line relocation which is approx. \$1,500.

### 9. Scott Spangler Trailer Park-Orchard

Mr. Spangler would like the meters relocated on the property. Mr. Robertson is to speak with him in the coming days.

### 10. Four Fillies Waterline Extension

Mr. Young has an easement from the District in hand that Porter is waiting to get back.

<u>A motion was made to approve the easement thru Chimney Ridge MHP down to Four Fillies.</u>

### 11. Outstanding Taps (Water & Sewer)

Porter reported that all taps have been installed except one in Cashmere which they intend to install in the next week.

Whitney reported that both water and sewer had lost money as a result of expenses for the relocation of the waterline on the golf course (Horney), the chlorinator at the water plant, and quarterly insurance payments.
